General Education Learning Outcomes (GELOs)

GELO 1 **Knowledge**

Demonstrate an understanding of how knowledge is acquired within and across different disciplinary domains, and how it applies to aspects of their own lives and experiences as a future professional and citizen;

GELO 2 **Application**

Apply a broad range of attitudes and skills, including those relating to the seven GELOs, different kinds of thinking and communication, to inquire into various academic and practical issues;

GELO 3 **Judgements**

Make good judgements and ethical decisions, based on values and standards which are sensible and reasonable;

GELO 4 **Expression**

Express their own ideas clearly and confidently after critically inquiring into and reflecting on various theories, perspectives, stances and experiences;

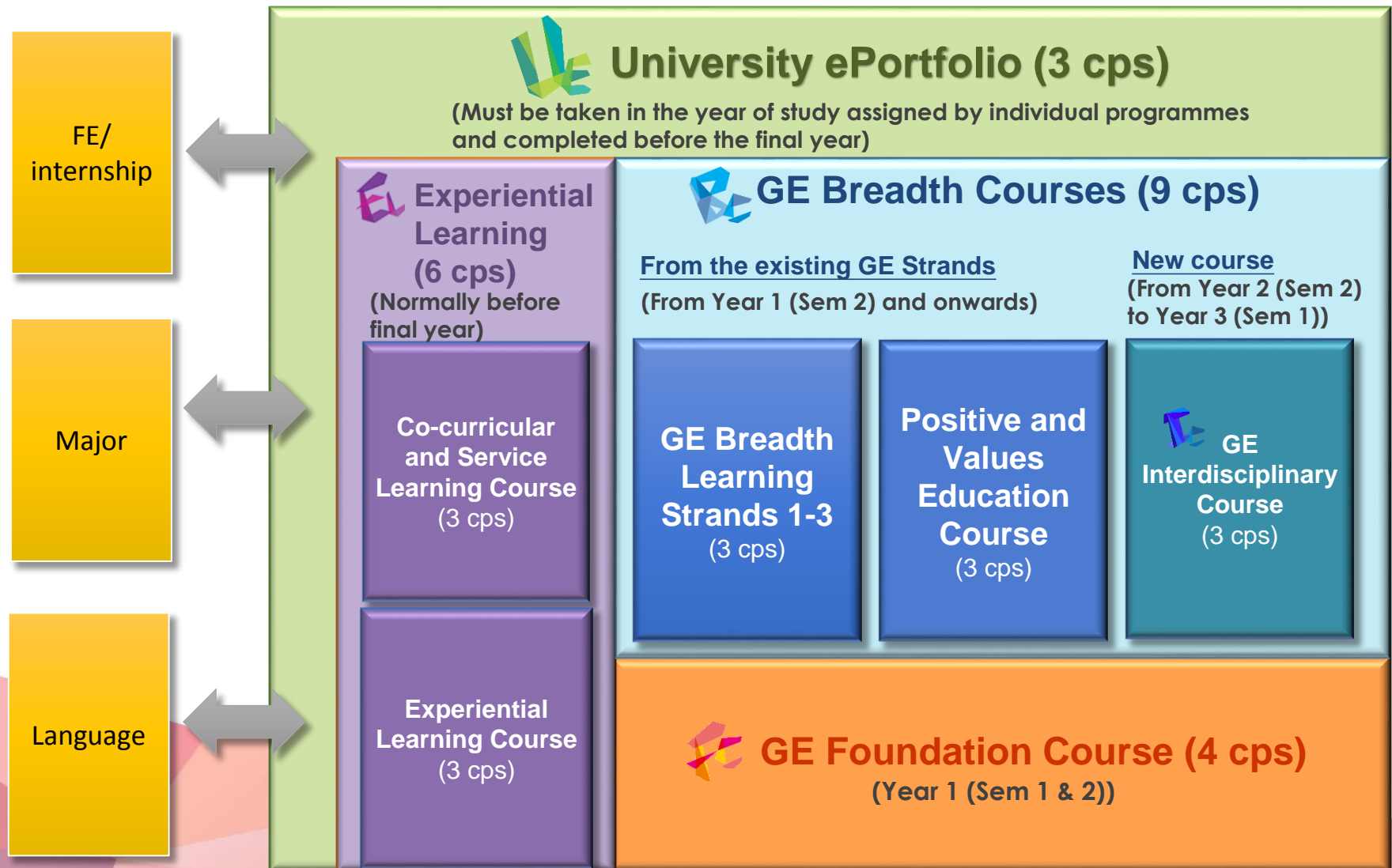
GELO 5 **Awareness**

Show that they are aware of local, regional and global issues, and construct informed and thoughtful responses to these issues;

GELO 6 **Engagement**

Demonstrate intellectual and civic engagement through active participation in and reflection on various co-curricular, service, and experiential learning activities.

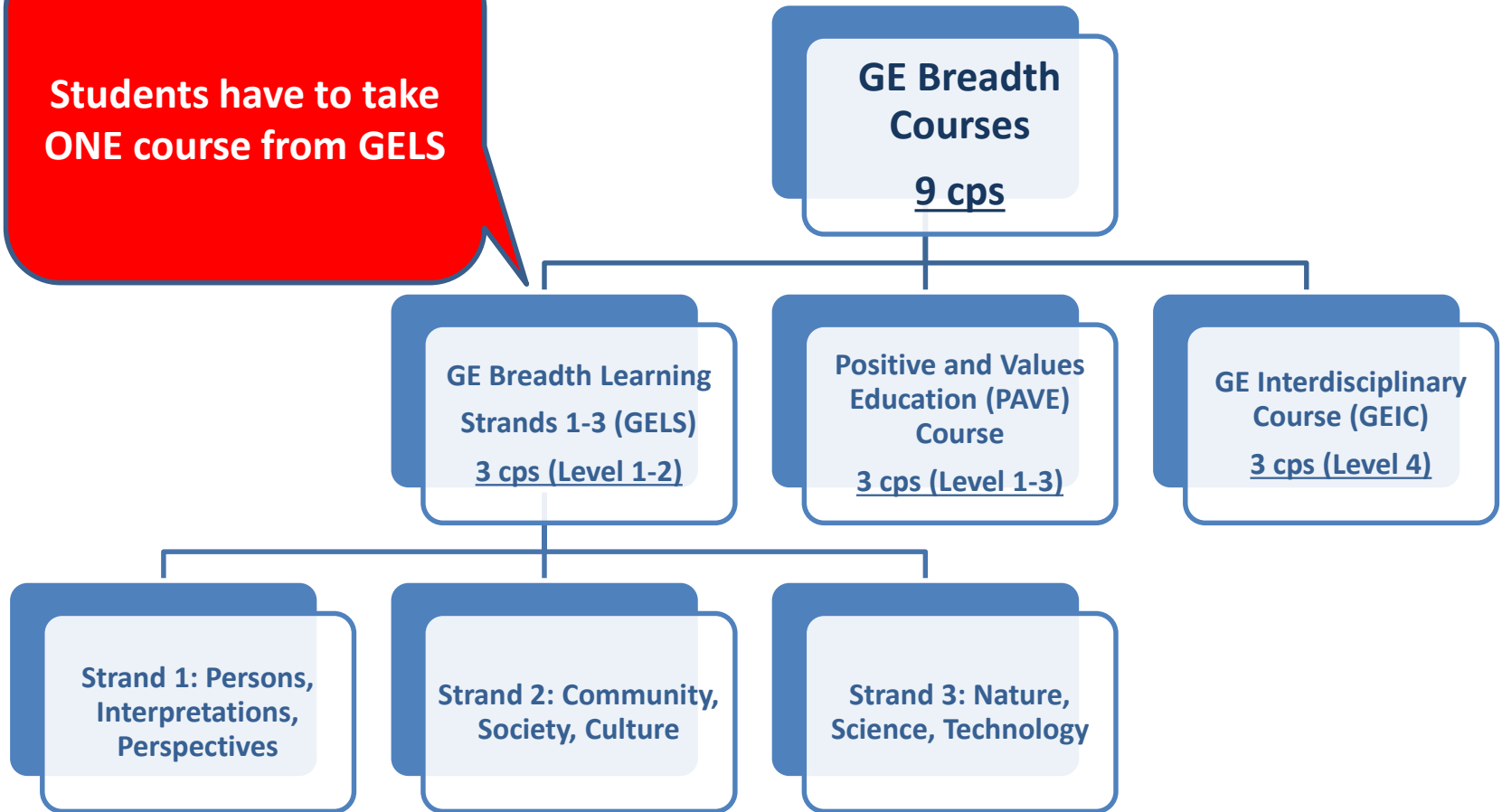

GE Breadth Courses

Period of Study

- **GELS and PAVE Courses:**

- Normally taken upon the completion of the GE Foundation Course.
- Students are also allowed to take the GE Foundation Course and GELS/PAVE Course concurrently **in Semester 2 (Year 1)** if they are interested and their curriculum schedule allows.
- **NO pre-requisite** is required.

- **GEIC:**

- To be taken **from Year 2 Semester 2 to Year 3 Semester 1**
- Pre-requisite: any GELS or PAVE Course (but NO pre-requisite for Senior Year Entry students)

- Students are required to complete all GEBCs (9 cps) before taking the University ePortfolio Course.
- Students can choose to take GEBCs in the Summer Semester

GE Breadth Courses

Block Credit Transfer of GELS and PAVE Course for Outbound Exchange Programme

- Maximum 6 cps
- Course-to-course matching is not required
- NOT applicable to pure language/ language proficiency courses (exceptions: linked with subject contexts e.g. Culture)

Course Pre-requisites

Completed GE Foundation Course

GEBCs

Completed **all GE Breadth Courses required***

- *Students from DD programmes are not required to take GELS (3cp).

Study Period

Students have to take a UePortfolio course **in the semester of study assigned** by individual programmes.

Course Registration

- Students will need to register for any 1 of the UePortfolio courses via online course registration
- Students have to take UePortfolio in the semester of study assigned by individual programmes
- Registration on a first-come-first-served basis
- NO add/drop is allowed
- NOT allowed to change the UePortfolio group

Assessment

Reflective Entry

- To complete a **reflective entry** based on reflections from class meetings, sharing sessions and discussions.

Individual Presentation

- To present the progress towards the **Individual University ePortfolio construction** to peers.

Individual University ePortfolio

- To submit **annotated ePortfolios** at the end of the course.
